How To Play Petanque

Teams

Pétanque may be played as singles, doubles, or triples

1. Singles, each player plays with 3 boules
2. Doubles, each player plays with 3 boules
3. Triples, each player plays with 2 boules

6m ↔ 10m

Start of the game

Flip a coin to see who goes first. The winner of the coin flip (Team A) starts the game by drawing or placing a circle on the ground (50 cm across)

1. Team A starts the round by tossing the jack to a distance of 6 m to 10 m from the circle
2. Team A points the first boule
3. Team B plays the second boule. The player may point or shoot, depending on the circumstances.

Order of play

The team that does NOT have the closest boule to the jack must play another boule until:

1. they have the closest boule
2. they run out of boules



Scoring (after round ends)

Points are awarded at the end of the round. Only the team with the closest boule to the jack scores in the round. That team scores 1 point for each boule they have closer to the jack than the closest boule of their opponent.

Start of new round

The team that won the last round starts the next round. The new circle should be around the last position of the jack.

Pétanque, pronounced "pay-tonk" began in the Provence area of France in 1910. Similar to 'bocce' where you roll large balls close to the small wood target ball, with Pétanque (also known as "Boules") you throw metal balls, while standing, or crouching, with both feet on the ground.

Toss, or roll hollow steel balls ("boules") close to the target ball, a "Pig" or "cochonnet" (French for "piglet"). Take turns and the team that gets closest to the target ball when all balls are played, wins.
The target ball can be hit and moved at any time and totally change the game.
Goal is to reach 13 points.

'Bocce' needs a smooth, prepared court with markers and sideboards, Pétanque can be played on most outdoor surfaces, without any setup.
